## VILLAGE OF BUCHANAN RESOLUTION OPPOSING SPECTRA ENERGY'S ALGONQUIN GAS TRANSMISSION LINE

**WHEREAS**, Spectra Energy's Algonquin Gas Transmission LLC ("Spectra") is proposing to run a new 42 inch pipeline 1.2 miles beneath the Hudson River from Stony Point to Verplanck; and

WHEREAS, Spectra is proposing to replace 11.9 miles of 26 inch pipe with a 42 inch pipe from Verplanck, through the Village of Buchanan to Yorktown Heights in Westchester County, New York and 8 miles of the line between Southeast and Danbury Connecticut, running under high voltage power lines and numerous fault lines; and

WHEREAS, the expanded pipeline will be located within 500 feet of the Buchanan-Verplanck School and within one mile from churches and thousands of private homes; and

WHEREAS, Spectra's proposed pipeline with come ashore in roughly the same spot as the 1,000 megawatt high-voltage power line proposed by West Point Partners LLC and will cross paths just south of the entrance to the Indian Point Nuclear Power Plant, critically near the plant's spent fuel pool, and possibly become a target for terrorists; and

WHEREAS, an explosion of a gas line of this magnitude would be absolutely catastrophic.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Village Mayor and the Board of Trustees hereby opposes Spectra Energy's Algonquin Gas Transmission LLC proposed application and urges the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to protect the rights, health and safety of the residents of the Hamlet of Verplanck, Village of Buchanan, Town of Cortlandt and residents of the State of New York, and deny the instant application in its entirety.
